
Sec. 18-8. Juvenile curfew.

- (a) *Curfew hours.* Any child less than 18 years old in the town limits, when not accompanied by parent or guardian, must be off the streets by 11:00 p.m. through 5:00 a.m. the following morning, seven days per week. If attending employment, school or church functions or public meetings that continue after 11:00 p.m., he must return to his home immediately after the conclusion of such a meeting. The provisions of this section do not apply:
- (1) When the child is accompanied by his parent or other adult having lawful care and custody of the child.
 - (2) When the child is upon an emergency errand directed by his parent or adult having lawful care and custody of such child.
 - (3) When the child is returning directly home from a school activity, entertainment, recreational activity or dance.
 - (4) When the child is going to or returning directly home from lawful employment that makes it necessary to be in such place during the proscribed period of time.
 - (5) When the child is attending or traveling directly to or from an activity involving the exercise of First Amendment rights of free speech, freedom of assembly or free exercise of religion.
 - (6) When the child is in a motor vehicle with parental consent for normal travel. (Interstate and intrastate travel through the town is excepted in all cases from the curfew.)
- (b) *Report of law enforcement officers.* Any child under 18 years of age who remains on the street or in a place of business and not accompanied by parent or guardian is to be reported by any law enforcement officer to the county juvenile officer or justice of the peace.
